
ISUOG World Congress 2024

FINAL REPORT





The 2024 ISUOG World Congress was held at the **Hungexpo Congress and Exhibition Center** in Budapest, Hungary. With **2700** attendees in total, this was ISUOG's first fully inperson European Congress in since 2019.

The bright, open-plan Hungexpo venue provided the perfect space for delegates, speakers and exhibitors to **connect** with each other easily.

The event began with two **pre-Congress courses** on 14 September, followed by the 4-day Congress which showcased **cutting-edge research**, delivered by and for leaders in the field.

Delegates also had further opporunities to network at the welcome reception in the Exhibition Hall and the Congress party at the Akvárium Klub in central Budapest.



43 of which are within Europe.






Delegates by profession


